Last week at in Dooradoyle, Garryowen suffered a 10-39 loss to Clontarf leaving the senior side in eighth position division 1A.

Garryowen, who are now hovering above the drop zone, will make the trip south to face keenest rivals Cork Constitution in Temple Hill. The Cork side are looking to avenge their previous loss in October's 16-13 defeat in Dooradoyle.

"Our key decision makers in the back line are our half backs, Neil Cronin and Bill Johnston, and our full back Andy O'Byrne. They guide us around the field and will look to put us in the right places to score points." Head coach Conan Doyle commented. Johnston has been impressive in the Irish Under 20's camp despite his kicking prowess the Irish side lost to an emphatic Welsh side.

A control on discipline is vitally needed for the senior side in order to prevent Cork Constitution's out half Thomas Quinlan from racking up the points, which he effortlessly accomplished last Saturday at the Aviva.

The senior side will be given a much needed respite to not only enjoy the St. Patrick's day's festivities but to also rethink their gameplan in avoiding the drop.

The senior sides' following game will take place on the 8<sup>th</sup> of April against bottom of the barrel Old Belvedere.

The Dublin side almost scored their first win since December last week against Terenure but only received a crucial bonus point.

Belvedere have also gained the expertise of former Irish head coach and Garryowner Eddie O'Sullivan to the coaching mix in what will be an entertaining battle of survival in Dooradoyle.

Garryowen will meet Cork Constitution on Saturday the 25<sup>th</sup> of March at Temple Hill kick off is 2:30.
